



Enrollment & Instructional Faculty







The University of Arkansas has stated its intention to become a Top 50 public research university by 2021. The <u>Providing Transparency and Accountability to the People of Arkansas (TAP)</u> document identifies 15 goals to enhance the university in reputation, quality of life, aesthetics and services.

The goals identified here are drawn from the TAP document and provide the initial steps needed to begin the ascent to a Top 50 institution. The United States is home to 629 four-year public research institutions, and the University of Arkansas strives to be in the top 8 percent of that group.
